I am pleased to present the $12^{\rm th}$ Annual Report of the Auto Club of Western and Central NY Foundation for Traffic Safety, Inc.

2024 went by quickly as the Foundation continued to spread traffic safety messaging across the region. The board was pleased to collaborate with new organizations in 2024, while continuing long-standing partnerships. In the Rochester region, new partners include the Ogden Police Department, which requested bike safety support, and the University of Rochester Golisano Children's Hospital, which requested car seat funding for refugee families in need. In CNY, the Foundation was able to share Halloween safety tips with new audiences in Watertown, and AAA has been working closely with Onondaga County Traffic Safety Advisory Board (OCTSAB). In Buffalo, the Foundation joined forces with The Prevention Council to educate teen drivers on the dangers of impaired driving with bookmarks and public-facing events while continuing its relationship with the Buffalo Police Athletic League, which included car seats, bike helmets, and impaired driving education in 2024. A driver education scholarship was awarded to a student in need through Say Yes Buffalo.

In 2024, the Foundation invested in "car coasters" that are made of recycled tires. The coasters can be places in car cup holders and have an anti-distracted driving message on them reminding drivers to "disconnect and drive." AAA handed them out at events across the state.

The Foundation continued its efforts to reach a wide audience with radio Public Service Announcements that ran throughout most of the year in Rochester and Syracuse. Messages included distracted driving, impaired driving, the 100 Deadliest Days, Slow Down Move Over, and more.

In 2024, the Foundation continued to support the Talking AAA radio program on WECK in Buffalo, which is also a weekly podcast, to share safety advice to improve traffic safety awareness.

At the end of 2024, the Foundation once again supported the Buffalo New Year's Eve ball drop with a \$5,000 sponsorship as part of the Buffalo PAL sponsorship. Board Director Elizabeth Carey spoke at two press conferences, focusing on the dangers of impaired driving.

Donations for 2024 topped \$27,000, which will help support the mission to achieve greater awareness of traffic safety and improve the lives of all highway users. Thank you to our members for their ongoing support and our community partners for their dedication to traffic safety. We look forward to a safe and successful 2025.
